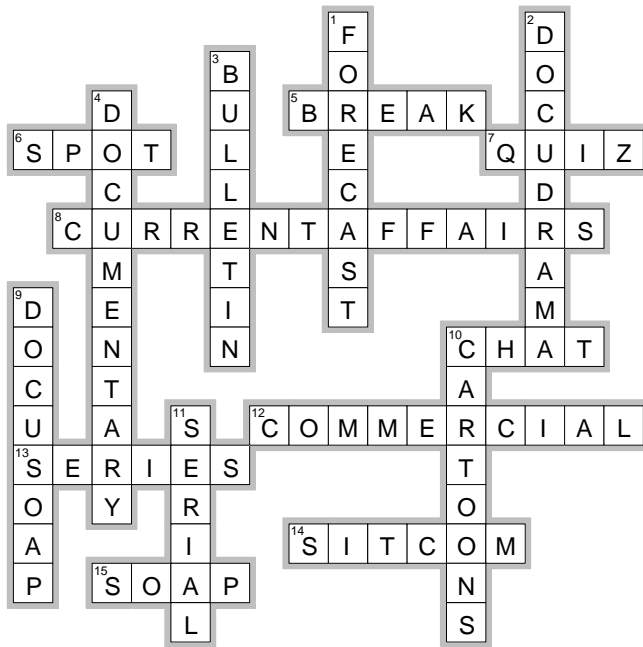


TV PROGRAMMES

- BREAK**—The short period of advertisements between television programmes (MAINLY UK): *I'll make us a cup of coffee in the next break.*
- SPOT**—A short length of time in a show which is given to a particular performer: *The comedian is doing a daily five-minute _____ on M^a Teresa Campos show.*
- QUIZ**—A game or competition in which you answer questions.
- CURRENTAFFAIRS**—Political news about events happening now.
- CHAT**—A _____ show (UK, also *talk show* US) is an informal television or radio programme on which famous people are asked questions about themselves and their work.
- COMMERCIAL**—An advertisement which is broadcast on television or radio.
- SERIES**—A set of television or radio broadcasts on the same subject or using the same characters but in different situations: *I missed the second episode of the _____ so I don't know what's going on now.*
- SITCOM**—An amusing television or radio show in which the same characters appear in each programme in a different story. (INFORMAL)
- SOAP**—A series of television or radio programmes about the lives and problems of a particular group of characters. The series continues over a long period and is broadcast (several times) every week. (INFORMAL)

- FORECAST**—The weather _____ is a statement of what the weather is likely to be for the next day or few days, usually broadcast on television or radio or printed in a newspaper.
- DOCUDRAMA**—A television programme whose story is based on an event or situation that really happened although it is not intended to be accurate in every detail.
- BULLETIN**—A news _____ is a short programme on television or radio often about something that has just happened.
- DOCUMENTARY**—A film or television or radio programme that gives facts and information about a subject: a biography, wildlife, history, etc.
- DOCUSOAP**—An entertaining programme about the lives of real people, especially people who live in the same place or do the same job.
- CARTOONS**—Films made using characters and images which are drawn rather than real, and which is usually amusing.
- SERIAL**—A story on television or radio or in a newspaper, etc. which is broadcast or printed in separate parts: *Her last novel has been made into a television _____.*
