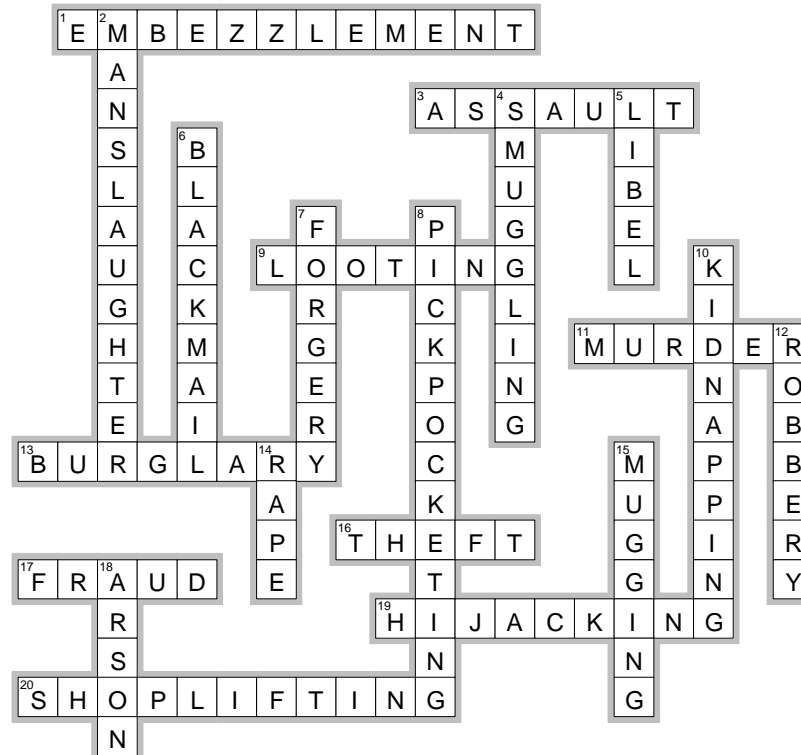


# CRIMES and OFFENCES

## KEY

### ACROSS

1. **EMBEZZLEMENT**—stealing money that is placed in your care, often over a period of time
3. **ASSAULT**—the crime of physically attacking someone
9. **LOOTING**—stealing from shops, buildings, etc. left unprotected after a violent event or a natural disaster such as an earthquake
11. **MURDER**—killing a person deliberately
13. **BURGLARY**—the crime of breaking into a house, a flat, etc. in order to steal things
16. **THEFT**—the crime of stealing
17. **FRAUD**—the crime of getting money from someone by tricking or deceiving them
19. **HIJACKING**—taking control of an airplane, train, etc. by force usually in order to make political demands
20. **SHOPLIFTING**—deliberately taking goods from a shop without paying for them



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### DOWN

2. **MANSLAUGHTER**—killing a person by accident or negligence
4. **SMUGGLING**—the crime of taking things or people illegally into or out of a country
5. **LIBEL**—printing or publishing something which is untrue and damages another person's reputation in some way
6. **BLACKMAIL**—demanding money or favours from someone by threatening to reveal a secret about them which, if made public, could cause the person embarrassment and harm
7. **FORGERY**—the crime of copying things such as banknotes, letters, official documents, etc. in order to deceive people
8. **PICKPOCKETING**—stealing things from people's pockets or handbags, usually in crowds or in public places
10. **KIDNAPPING**—taking a person away by force and keeping them prisoner, usually in order to demand money for their safe return
12. **ROBBERY**—the serious crime of stealing large amounts of money from a bank, a shop or a vehicle, often using force or threats of violence
14. **RAPE**—forcing someone to have sex with you
15. **MUGGING**—attacking someone, usually in a public place, in order to rob him or her
18. **ARSON**—the crime of deliberately setting fire to a building
