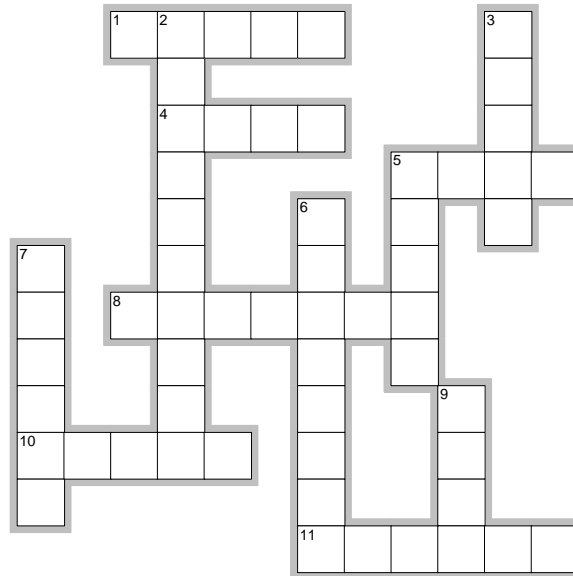

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ACROSS

- spell (MAGIC); spoken words which are thought to have magical power, or (the condition of being under) the influence or control of such words
- to copy someone else's work, especially dishonestly

- to make someone feel calm or less worried
- to hang loosely, or to hold something so that it hangs loosely

DOWN

- a thief who steals things out of pockets or bags, especially in a crowd

- someone who tries to make someone more important like them by being very polite and helpful in a way that is not sincere
