


# Getting Together

1. A person chosen or elected by a group to speak, vote, etc. for them, especially at a meeting.

8. An event, sometimes lasting a few days, at which there are a group of talks on a particular subject, or a meeting in which especially business matters are discussed formally.
9. An important formal meeting between leaders of governments from two or more countries: 'World leaders will meet next week for their annual economic \_\_\_\_\_.'
11. When two people who have never met each other go out for a romantic social meeting, you talk about a '\_\_\_\_\_ date'; either of the people who meet this way.
12. A friend (from school, work, someone you share a flat with, etc).
13. '\_\_\_\_\_ dating' is a type of matchmaking service where participants meet each other for a few minutes before moving on to another participant, ultimately making a list of those they are interested in dating.

2. A formal arrangement to meet or visit someone at a particular time and place: 'She had to cancel her dental \_\_\_\_\_.'
3. A plan for how something will happen: 'I've already made all the \_\_\_\_\_ for my birthday party.'
4. A party that you give when you move into a new house.
5. A kind of marriage in which the parents choose who their son or daughter will marry.
6. Gathering of people (school friends, family, etc.)
7. A person whom one knows but who is not a particularly close friend.
